Celebrating our 41st In-Person Space Camp

Space Voyage offers an intensive program of learning and confidence building within a space motif. Space Voyage brings to life the importance of math and science, builds confidence through genuine achievement, creates a sense of belonging, and offers a fun and fantastic place for kids to learn and grow. Based on cooperative learning, the program uses learning teams where everyone can achieve. Space Voyage Summer Camp can be a first-time experience for beginning students or a continuation of space flight studies for returning students. This camp is designed for students with an interest in the area of science, technology, engineering, the arts, and math. This STEM camp immerses students in "thinking and working as-if they are astronauts."

Space Voyage offers the environment and the encouragement for students to work hard and play hard while developing a strong work ethic. Pathfinders explore STEM technologies and learn about space, team work and new possibilities. Cadets and Interns use strengths to overcome weaknesses and develop the skills to achieve in school and beyond.

A Flight Director once described Space Voyage as one-part Montessori school, one-part Disney World and one-part Santa's House... A joyful place to learn, make new friends and achieve. We offer a competency based curriculum that immerses students in the world of being an Astronaut, research scientist, and artist. The program is progressively challenging, while meeting the unique learning needs and styles of each student.

To be successful, students should:

- 1) Be interested in space flight or being an astronaut
- 2) Be capable of independent work
- 3) Have the maturity of a child his or her own age.

The programs at Space Voyage Summer Camp are organized by level, with each level having specific requirements in knowledge, skill, confidence, teamwork and experience. This summer, Space Voyage offers three types of programs: Pathfinder Awareness programs (ages 6-8); Astronaut Cadet programs for (ages 9-16); and the Space Voyage Interns (ages 15+ and above).

Shuttle Flight and Space Station Simulators

For the Pathfinders (ages 6-8), the program is one of awareness and exploration. With hundreds of activities to select from, the instructors design week-long programs unique to the strengths and interests of the participants. Like Cadets, every Pathfinder is able to earn their own Space Flight Medal of Honor. Requirements are process based and include: Do your best; Ask questions; Tell the instructors what you need; and Work as a team when asked. Pathfinders work with the Program Director to create a unique mission crew patch which is used as a new notebook cover, wall art and in other ways during their week at camp.

In the Astronaut Cadet program (ages 9-16), students join a crew or team with other cadets, making a unique crew patch for the program week and tackling the level's challenges together. Crews explore and master the complex operations involved in space flight by building and managing a functioning space station during the capstone experience of the cadet week: the Space Voyage Simulation or "Time Study."

In the Space Voyage Intern Program (ages 14+) students are immersed in a leadership experience working with staff and cadet crews. Interns may or may not have had prior experience with the program.

About The Camp Staff

Dr. Palmere has an extensive background in inspiring, motivating, and empowering high-potential students. Dr. Palmere has led the Space Voyage programs since 1987, immersing students in "thinking like an astronaut" and encouraging skill development in the areas of problem solving, communication, teamwork, aeronautics and leadership. Dr. Palmere holds a B.S. in Biological Science, a Master's degree in Educational Psychology and a double doctorate in Psychological and Cultural Studies, and School Administration, Curriculum and Instruction.

Camp Counselors and Certified Instructors at Space Voyage Summer Camp are carefully screened, knowledgeable, are good role models, great teachers and communicators, and have strong character. We plan on having one staff member for every six participants (1:6). Cadet mission crews are assigned a primary instructor, and a Flight Director is responsible for all crews and Instructors each week. Dr. Palmere, as the Program Director serves as the Primary Instructor for all Pathfinders.

Everyone Earns Their Own Medal

Specific objectives for each program are given to the students at the beginning of the program week. Instructors and Camp Counselors assist, guide, and monitor progress of each student, signing off requirements upon completion. When all objectives are complete, the Flight Director formally recommends the student for recognition of completion of that level. At an awards ceremony, a Space Flight Medal of Honor is presented. Space Voyage Summer Camp is designed for every student to achieve.

Astronaut Pathfinder Programs: For Ages 6-8

Programs are based on grade level the student is entering in the coming fall:

Pathfinder 1 - Entering First Grade

Pathfinder 2 - Entering Second Grade

Pathfinder 3 - Entering Third Grade

In the Pathfinder Program, focus is on awareness and exploration of space studies through hands-on activities. Pathfinders are responsible for creating a crew patch as a team and create a variety of artistic projects which can be taken home and enjoyed during the school year.

About the Astronaut Cadet Level: For Ages 9-16

The different cadet levels are based on the knowledge, skill, confidence and experience needed to complete the objectives for that level. The cornerstones of our achievement model are: the scientific method, vision, persistence, and sustained effort. Each level of achievement builds on the one before, allowing the students to experience an open-ended and sophisticated learning experience that takes place over time.

Description of Astronaut Cadet Competency Levels

Level 1 Exploration and introduction to spaceflight mission planning, space flight operations, space station construction and teamwork.

Level 2 Mastery of spaceflight mission planning, shuttle flight, space pod control, flight documentation and teamwork.

Level 3 Proficiency in space operations. Successful construction of a space station and management of a research project aboard their Space Station. Passing this level is contingent on passing an Oxford style oral exam with a council of their peers.

Level 4 Expertise in space operations. Successful construction of a space station and management of multiple research projects aboard their Space Station. Passing this level is contingent on passing an Oxford style oral exam with a council of their peers.

Level 5 Author a novel or radio drama based on actual events that might occur aboard a space station. Level 5 cadets share their knowledge, expertise and passion about space flight.

Level 6 Inventor. Work with senior staff to invent, design and help certify a new technology that can be used at Space Voyage. Space Voyage defines a technology as any thing you can interact with and learn from.

Space Intern Program: For ages 15 and above

This leadership program immerses high school students and college students in a leader-in-training program. Interns work under the direction of Dr. Palmere and will learn about leadership first hand. Participating students will have the opportunity to observe, learn, apply their new knowledge, and reflect with senior staff. Upon successful completion of their internship, each student will receive a Certificate of Achievement, be able to list the internship experience on college applications, and may use Space Voyage as a reference. Many Interns apply for, and become Camp Counselors at Space Voyage, in years following their Internship. For questions, please call Dr. Palmere.

Joining The Staff

Space Voyage is a student led program under the direction of the program director. Cadets demonstrating proficiency, by completing Level 3, can apply to the Student Instructor Apprentice (SIA) program. Upon completion of their apprenticeship they are "certified" as Space Voyage Instructors and become paid staff. Instructors continue to achieve cadet levels during weeks they are not serving as instructors. Space Voyage Instructors are immersed in a leadership competency program consisting of five tiers or levels of responsibility.

THE REGISTRATION PROCESS. . .

Registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. If a camp week reaches capacity, you can join a wait-list through the website.

Use our Online Registration and Payment Gateway to register one or more children for one or more weeks. You may pay online using PayPal or any credit card. Please follow the 'Register Now' link on the website. All registrations will be online only. Note that during registration, there are optional items to purchase. These include: Crew Mission Patch Wall Art, Crew Mouse Pad, Crew Mug, and extra t-Shirt. Additional items purchased during registration will be delivered at camp. These items can be bought at camp as well.

DISCOUNTS:**Sibling Discounts:** Register two or more students and take 5% off for each student. Register multiple kids at the same time and save. Use coupon code **MC5** during checkout to receive the discount on your cart total.**Multiple Week Discount:** Register one student for two weeks (or more) and take 5% off all weeks.Use coupon code **MW5** during checkout to receive the discount on your cart total.**Multiple Children Attending Multiple Weeks Discount:** If you have multiple children coming for more than one week, take 10 percent off the cart total. Use coupon code **MCMW10** during checkout. Maximum discount is 10 percent.**How To Register:**

- 1) Review the brochure and website for information. Check the website for availability. If weeks are full, complete wait list request.
- 2) All registrations and payments are done online. Follow the 'Register Now' link on the website. You can register for one or multiple weeks, and for one or more children at the same time. Note your email and zipcode, and you can use these to return and register again at a future time, if needed. Use the discount codes to save money.
- 3) Upon completion of online registration you will receive a Email confirmation and receipt Email from Paypal.
We will share a Welcome Letter, along with Medical Form, Liability Waiver and Covid-19 Waiver via email and an online Parent Portal. Likewise, you will be able to upload completed forms and waivers to us using the same Parent Portal. You will receive login information about the Parent Portal, from the system, after your payment is complete. You may also mail these to us via USPS.
- 4) Please complete the waivers as soon as possible. Your students registration is not complete until we have these on file.
- 5) No child may attend at camp without a completed Medical Form, and Liability Waiver on file.
- 6) Arrival Instructions for your camp week will be in the Parent Portal, as well as Emailed to your just before your camp week begins.

Note: You can register one child at a time, or register all at once to secure discounts. You can use your Email and zip code to return to BoxOffice to register another child or week as you wish. After you register, you will receive an invitation to the Space Voyage Customer Account Portal that allows parents to upload forms and waivers. IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT SPACE VOYAGE**About the Camp Day and Week.**

All camp sessions are 8:00 am to 3:30 pm. Some weeks are full 5-day weeks, others Maker Lab weeks are 3-day weeks. Students can arrive starting at 7:30 am and we offer free after care until 4:00 pm. Students must be picked up by 4:00 pm. Daycare fees will apply to students being picked up after 4:00 pm to cover staff overtime.

A. Registration Process.

Discuss camp with family and friends, select week or weeks to attend. Register online through the website. Register one child at a time for one or more weeks. Use discount codes during payment (see page 3). Return forms mailed to your in a timely manner using our Space Voyage Parent Portal or via USPS mail.

B. Summer Camp Location, Address and Directions.

Camp will be held at Coronado Elementary School, in the gym, at 7922 South Carr St., Littleton, Colorado 80128. You can see a Google Map to the school by visiting our website and clicking on the Map link on top nav bar. Should the school be used for Summer School or Day Care, we reserve the right to change the camp location or another school, within seven miles. (Probably either Powderhorn Elem, or Mortensen Elem)

C. Transportation.

Transportation to and from each program location is a guardian responsibility. Email us if you are interested in carpooling or need carpool information.

D. Crew Size and Crew Mission Patches.

While camp group size is 12-24, crew size is typically two to four students. Students will make many new friends at camp. Students are encouraged to attend Space Voyage Summer Camp with their friends. Each crew designs a unique Mission Crew Patch which becomes their Space Voyage Notebook Cover and mission logo while at camp. Commemorative Crew Mission Patch Wall Art (approximately 10.5" x 10.5") and suitable for on-wall display are available for \$15 each. These should be ordered by Wednesday of your camp week to ensure delivery while at camp. They can also be mailed for +\$5 S&H. Wall Art, Crew Mugs, Crew Mouse Pads and Extra Camp T-shirts can be purchased during online registration, or at camp.

E. Space Voyage Summer Camp Lunch, Snack and Food Policies

Students should bring a non-refrigerated lunch to camp each day. You can bring your own drinks, or purchase a drink for one dollar. Free edible lessons include: Gold Fish Social, Hot Dog Space Station, Edible Space Station, and Ice Cream Cone Space Odyssey. Please share food allergy information on your child's Medical Form and with staff during check-in at camp. On Friday of each week we have a pizza party lunch. We'll send home daily flyers as reminders.

F. Refund Policy and Fees

Legal Notice: Full refunds, less a \$50 administrative fee and processing fees, are available if requested before March 31, 2024. Partial-half refunds, less a \$50 administrative fee and processing fees, are offered until May 1st, 2024. No refunds after May 1st, 2024. Your receipt will be Emailed to you upon payment. All fees are due and paid during online registration. If the in-person camp is cancelled due to a pandemic, or for any other reason, the camp will become a virtual camp for the weeks scheduled. Space Voyage reserves the right to move the camp (within 7 miles) should the school district cancel our facilities contract.

Frequently Asked Questions? (See website for more FAQ)**Q1: How are the students grouped?**

Crews are formed based on program level, age and conceptual level. Students attending with friends can be placed on the same crew.

Q2: Can I complete a Level in a week? Or more than one Level in a week?

All Pathfinder levels and Cadets in Level 1 and Level 2, are designed to be completed in one week. Cadet Levels 3, and above take longer since more time is needed to achieve. Cadets can continue their Level from one camp week to another and from this summer to next summer. Leadership Internships can last one or more weeks. Inspired and motivated students sometimes complete Cadet Level 1 and Level 2 in one week. You and your crew work at the pace you choose. Space Voyage is a self-paced, competency based program.

Q3: How does each day break down?

Students arrive between 7:30am and 8:00am. We'll have our key Morning Briefing at 8:00am; Lunch is when the room gets hungry, but typically starts around 11:20; Afternoon program runs after lunch until 3:30pm. After hours care/Play-hard from 3:30pm until 4:00pm sharp. Students must be picked up by 4:00pm, or the Space Voyage staff ask for additional child-care fees.
